Creatively style and dress hair



Overview

This unit is about using a variety of conventional and non-conventional styling techniques to produce an innovative, fashionable, creative and personalised look to complement individual clients. The ability to combine and adapt a variety of styling techniques incorporating accessories and/or added hair is required in this unit.

The main outcomes of this unit are:

- 1. maintain effective and safe methods of working when styling hair
- 2. creatively style and dress hair
- 3. provide aftercare service
