

<b>Protect farmed game bird welfare in manual bleeding operations</b>

<p><b>Unit summary</b> This unit supports workforce development for those whose role includes responsibilities for the protection of farmed game bird welfare in manual bleeding operations.</p> <p>The unit is designed for use by operatives and others who monitor and handle birds on a slaughter line or individually after the bird has been cut for bleeding. The aim of the unit is to determine competent performance to recognised National Occupational Standards. This unit meets the requirements of EU regulation 1099/2009 for the protection of animals at time of killing.</p>	
<p><b>Assessment requirements /guidance</b> This unit is designed to assess the skills and knowledge of learners in the workplace for roles including responsibilities for the protection of farmed game bird welfare in manual bleeding operations.</p> <p>The learner must be able to demonstrate their competent performance consistently over a period of time, to meet all of the assessment criteria. This will be achieved by at least two observations of competent performance in the workplace, and may be supported by witness testimony and other workplace evidence. Observations must ensure that the learner's working practice is at commercial speed and in compliance with standard operating procedures. Assessment methods appropriate to the learner must be used to generate evidence of knowledge and understanding – which can be assessed on or off the job.</p> <p>The Improve Assessment Strategy for Qualifications in Food and Drink, Scotland sets out the overarching assessment requirements.</p>
