**EVIDENCE REQUIREMENTS**

Written and/or oral evidence for both performance criteria.

**OUTCOME**

2. OPERATE INDUSTRY STANDARD DESK TOP PUBLISHING SYSTEMS

**PERFORMANCE CRITERIA**

- (a) Implementation of start-up procedures and system checks is efficient, unprompted and complies with standard practice.
- (b) Document format established is correct for a particular purpose.
- (c) Incorporation and manipulation of text and graphics files is effective.

- (d) Proof document created contains all given items and layout is effective.
- (e) Implementation of output procedures for a single copy is efficient, unprompted and complies with standard practice.

**RANGE STATEMENT**

The range for this outcome is fully expressed in the performance criteria.

**EVIDENCE REQUIREMENTS**

Performance evidence for Performance Criteria (a), (c) and (e). Product evidence for Performance Criteria (a), (b), (c) and (d).

**OUTCOME**

- 3. PRODUCE A SHORT COMMUNICATION ON A DESK TOP PUBLISHING SYSTEM

**PERFORMANCE CRITERIA**

- (a) Research and assembly of source files, data and information for a particular topic is effective.
- (b) Document produced effectively incorporates assembled files in report or article format and extends to at least two pages.
- (c) Style, structure and layout of document are to the standards required for in-house or community use.

**RANGE STATEMENT**

The range for this outcome is fully expressed in the performance criteria.

**EVIDENCE REQUIREMENTS**

Performance evidence supplemented by product for Performance Criterion (a).

Product evidence for Performance Criteria (b) and (c).

**MERIT PASS WITH MERIT**

Pass with merit may be awarded to a candidate who achieves all outcomes and in so doing consistently demonstrates superior performance when, for example:

- (a) producing documents on a Desk Top Publishing system.

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## **ASSESSMENT**

In order to achieve this unit, candidates are required to present sufficient evidence that they have met all the performance criteria for each outcome within the range specified. Details of these requirements are given for each outcome. The assessment instruments used should follow the general guidance offered by the SQA assessment model and an integrative approach to assessment is encouraged. Accurate records should be made of the assessment instruments used showing how evidence is generated for each outcome and giving marking schemes and/or checklists, etc. Records of candidates' achievements should be kept. These records will be available for external verification.
