Type and Purpose

A <u>specialist</u> module which enables the student to finish modern upholstery and bedding.

Preferred Entry Level 04500: Trim and Upholstery Sewing

05404: Modern Upholstery and Bedding Preparation

05604: Materials for Soft Furnishings

Learning Outcomes

The student should:

- 1. know the principle fittings, components and assembly techniques;
- 2. know and use a range of upholstery/bedding tools and machinery;
- 3. fit, sew and fix a range of upholstery covers to prepared frames;
- 4. comply with regulations and procedures and use safe working practices specified for equipment and work areas.

Content/ Context

Corresponding to the Learning Outcomes:

- (a) knowledge of installation, operation and working principles of the following components and types of furniture:
 - (i) bed-settees, recliners, swivels and rockers with individual seat arm and back units:
 - (ii) sectionalised frames;
 - (iii) KID fittings;
 - (iv) castors, glides, etc.;

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- (b) knowledge of batch assembly techniques.
- 2. (a) use of button making machine;
 - (b) knowledge of principles relating to quilting machines, di-electric welding machine, buttoning machines, cushion filling machines;
 - (c) upholstery and bedding tools.
- 3. fitting and fixing of a selection from: flat weave, pile, PVC coated fabric, hide.
- 4. safety precautions and regulations relevant to tools, equipment, behaviour and work.

Suggested Learning and Teaching Approaches

It is envisaged that the general teaching approach will be activity/workshop based and student centred.

The learning programme should interest the student and relate to a theme or vocational bias.

Critical skills and techniques should be demonstrated prior to student involvement.

Posters, information sheets, worksheets, workfiles, slides, films and video may be used to enhance the learning environment and process.

A set of completed exercises should be available for students to work to and compare standards.

Safety, safe working practices and care and use of equipment should be an integral part of all module activities.

Assessment Procedures

All Learning Outcomes must be validly assessed.

The student must be informed of the tasks which contribute to summative assessment. Any unsatisfactory aspects of performance should, if possible, be discussed with the student as and when they arise.

Acceptable performance in the module will be satisfactory achievement of the performance criteria specified for each Learning Outcome.
