Content/ Context		Corresponding to Learning Outcomes 1-4:		
	1.	Use of various media, e.g. pencil, pen, pen and wash, crayon, markers, charcoal, coloured pencils, water-colour gouache, collage.		
	2.	Detailed studies in a variety of media of the posed model. These studies should explore the complexities of surface anatomy and the formal relationship of life forms in different visual contexts.		
	3.	Preparation of drawings exposing and exploring the underlying abstract and expressionistic qualities to be found in life forms.		

4. Mounting techniques including window mounting, two-tone effects, surrounding outlines.

Suggested Learning and Teaching Approaches

The tutor should demonstrate the various working methods, and show examples of different styles and techniques to the student.

Comparisons should be made between modern visual approaches to life drawing from eg. Matisse, Degas, Picasso, Modigliani and more traditional masters; Rembrandt, David, Fragonard, Ingres.

It would be advantageous to use nude models.

All drawings for this module will be retained as part of a portfolio.

Assessment Procedures

Acceptable performance in the module will be the satisfactory achievement of the performance criteria specified for each Learning Outcome.
