Students should be encouraged to listen to music similar in style and instrumentation to the medium they are using.

Working with instruments and/or voices, students should explore the possibilities of expressing ideas in sound by means of working singly and in groups. The tutor should advise on matters of appropriate instrumentation, voicing, timbre, tempo, texture, form, etc and encourage an awareness of melodic, rhythmic and harmonic possibilities.

Students should explore the possibilities of developing ideas in sound. They should be encouraged to refine their critical faculties and to be constantly aware of any possibilities for the improvement of their compositions. Students should also keep a diary of their notes explaining in words and/or notation how their work has evolved.

Where necessary the tutor may refer students to simple devices for notation.

Assessment Formative assessment should operate as an integral

- Procedures part of learning and teaching in the module. It may include assessment of the student's work by the tutor, by the student and by peers. This will be achieved in the main through discussion of work completed. Work should be recorded on audio for playback and review. Each student should keep a diary of work during this module. Diaries and audio recordings should be available to a Subject Assessor. Each student should be issued with an information sheet explaining the purposes of the module:
  - (a) it informs the students of the minimum which is taught and learned;
  - (b) it informs the students of the learning and teaching activities they will undertake (this section of the information sheet is open and is completed by the tutor);

The performance criteria which follow provide tutors and students with a statement of the minimum which is required. Many students, given the opportunity and encouragement may go well beyond the minimum requirements. A decision on whether or not a student has achieved the criteria should be taken only after he/she has had the benefit of additional teaching support to revise and improve on unsatisfactory efforts. Acceptable performance in the module will be satisfactory achievement of all the performance criteria specified for each Learning outcome.

The following abbreviations are used below:
