2004 Marking Scheme

1. State the theme your group chose to explore and give **one** reason for your choice. **2 marks**

One mark awarded for stating theme.
One mark awarded for giving a reason.

2. Outline the drama presentation based on your chosen theme, showing clearly how your drama begins, develops and ends.
Your answer should include details of the time and place of your drama. **6 marks**

Candidate has given:

A clear, concise outline of the presentation, showing clearly how the drama begins, develops and ends.
Details of the time and place are also stated. **5-6 marks**

A fairly clear outline of the presentation, showing how the drama begins, develops and ends.
Time and place not always stated. **3-4 marks**

A limited or muddled summary of the presentation, showing little indication of how the drama begins, develops and ends.
Time and place not always stated. **0-2 marks**

As a rule, one mark should be awarded for stating the time and place. If this is not shown, one mark should be deducted.

3. From the following list choose any **two** theatre arts which you used, or would like to have used, in your presentation.

- Set Design
- Sound
- Lighting
- Costume
- Make-up
- Props

You should explain **how** you used, or would like to have used, them giving details of **where, when** and **why**.

8 marks

Candidate has given:

A clear description of **how** the **two** chosen theatre arts were used or may have been used - with a clear explanation of **where, when** and **why** they were used or may have been used.

7-8 marks

An adequate description of **how** the **two** chosen theatre arts were used or may have been used - giving some explanation of **where, when** and **why** they were used or may have been used.

4-6 marks

A limited description of **how one** or **two** chosen theatre arts were used or may have been used - and giving little or no explanation of **where, when** and **why** they were used or may have been used.

0-3 marks

- 4 (a)** From your presentation, choose a character **other than your own** and complete the following character information sheet for **that character**. **8 marks**
- Full name of character/age of character **1 mark**
- Candidate has given:
- Name of character stating both the forename and the surname of the character being played. Age of character is also stated. **1 mark**
- A limited or partial response to the question with information omitted. **0-half marks**
- Occupation - mark awarded for stating character's occupation. **1 mark**
- Physical description - a detailed physical description of the character. **1 mark**
- A limited, or muddled physical description of the character. **0-half marks**
- Hobbies/interests - a detailed description of hobbies/interests. **1 mark**
- A limited, muddled description of hobbies/interests. **0-half marks**
- Attitudes/beliefs - a detailed account of the character's attitude's beliefs. **1 mark**
- A limited or muddled account of the character's attitude beliefs. **0-half marks**
- Personality - a detailed description of the character's personality. **1 mark**
- A limited, or muddled description of the character's background. **0-half marks**
- Background – a detailed description of the character's background. **1 mark**
- A limited, or muddled description of the character's background. **0-half marks**
- Other relevant information - a detailed account of any information not already stated relating to the character. **1 mark**
- A limited or muddled account of information not already stated relating to the character. **0-half marks**
- (b)** Explain how **your character** felt about the character described by you in question 4(a). Give reasons for your answer. **2 marks**
- Candidate has given:
- A clear explanation of how his/her character felt about the character described in question 4(a). Statement should be justified. **2 marks**
- A limited or muddled explanation of how his/her character felt about the character described in question 4(a). Statement is limited or lacks any justification. **0-1 mark**

5. Describe how **the character played by you** would use voice and movement to show their feelings to an audience. **4 marks**

Candidate has given:

A clear description of how the character would use **voice** to show their feelings to an audience.

Reference may be made to pace, pitch, tone, volume, intonation, clarity, fluency, accent, register. **2 marks**

A limited or muddled description of how the character would use **voice** to show their feelings to an audience. **0-1 mark**

A clear description of how the character would use **movement** to show their feelings to an audience.

Reference may be made to use of space, gesture, body language, positioning, facial expression, stance. **2 marks**

A limited or muddled description of how the character would use movement to show their feelings to an audience. **0-1 mark**
