Examples of the Extraneous Rule

NB. For the extraneous rule to apply, the candidate must have exceeded the total number of items for which points are awarded and the additional information given must be wrong. The maximum deduction per question/sub-question for extraneous material is 1 point.

General Listening : Question 11

Example 1 Tour the area.
Go to a farm where they make cheese.

Example 2 Go on a bus tour and visit a farm.

Example 3 Do a bus tour.
Go to a farm where cheese is produced and buy some.

Example 4 Go round the region by car and visit a factory where they make cheese.

Example 5 Go on a tour of the region, buy some cheese then come home.

Example 6 Doing a tour of the area. Going by bus. Going to a farm where they make cheese.

Example 1 Two correct statements. = 2 points

Example 2 First statement correct. Second statement insufficient = 1 point

Example 3 First and second statements correct. Third statement wrong.
Extraneous rule applies. Deduct one point. = 1 point

Example 4 Both statements wrong. = 0 points

Example 5 First statement correct. Second and third statements wrong.
Extraneous rule applies. Deduct 1 point. = 0 points

Example 6 Three correct statements. = 2 points

Notation When applying the extraneous rule, put a stroke through the long arm
of a tick (✓) and write a capital letter E beside it.
