Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to allow learners to develop the simple, practical skills and knowledge which support fashion and textile-related activity such as weaving, collage, knitting, crochet, and items for drama and dance.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Demonstrate simple practical skills and knowledge in working creatively with textiles
- 2 Produce a simple creative textile item

This Unit is an optional Unit of the Access 2 Creative Arts Course and is also available as a free-standing Unit. Outcome 1

The learner will:

The learner will:

 - 2.1 Choosing a simple item
 - 2.2 Choosing materials and equipment essential to making the item
 - 2.3 Using selected materials and equipment appropriately
 - 2.4 Following safe work practices for using the equipment correctly
 - 2.5 Completing the item

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

Evidence may be presented for individual Outcomes or it may be gathered for the Unit as a whole through integrating assessment holistically for both Outcomes. If the latter approach is used, it must be clear how the evidence covers each Outcome.

For Outcomes 1 and 2, evidence which demonstrates the learner selecting and using appropriate skills, materials and equipment to produce a simple creative textile item is required. Evidence which demonstrates the learner appropriately preparing materials for the creative textile item is also required. At least two different forms of materials should be selected and prepared.

Evidence should capture the processes followed by the learner while using their skills, techniques and ideas, as well as the creative textile work.

Evidence which demonstrates the learner using equipment safely and correctly is required.

Only one creative textile item is required to provide the evidence.

Evidence can be provided in the form of logs, checklists, photographic evidence, video evidence or equivalent.

Exemplification of assessment will be provided in the *National Assessment Resource*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.

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Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit. The skills that learners will be expected to improve on and develop through the Unit are based on SQA's *Skills Framework: Skills for Learning, Skills for Life and Skills for Work* and drawn from the main skills areas listed below. These must be built into the Unit where there are appropriate opportunities.
