Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to develop learners' skills in working with different woodworking and/or metalworking materials. Learners will develop skills in cutting, shaping, fixing and joining different materials, using a variety of appropriate craft techniques. Through these activities, learners also learn good practice in sustainability and recycling in a practical craft context.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Identify a variety of materials used in practical woodworking and/or metalworking
- 2 Work with a selected range of materials to complete basic woodworking and/or metalworking tasks

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the Access 3 Practical Craft Skills Course and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes* which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work. Exemplification of the standards in this Unit is given in the *National Assessment Resource*.

Outcomes and assessment standards

Outcome 1

The learner will:

- 1 Identify a variety of materials used in practical woodworking and/or metalworking by:**
 - 1.1 Identifying basic materials, using correct names and terminology
 - 1.2 Selecting, with guidance, materials appropriate for the task
 - 1.3 Completing a simple parts or cutting list for the chosen task
 - 1.4 Describing good practice in sustainability and recycling

Outcome 2

The learner will:

- 2 Work with a selected range of materials to complete basic woodworking and/or metalworking tasks by:**
 - 2.1 Selecting and preparing, with guidance, appropriate materials for the task
 - 2.2 Cutting and shaping, with guidance, selected materials in accordance with the task,
 - 2.3 Using appropriate craft techniques, with guidance, to fix and join materials
 - 2.4 Using materials in accordance with good practice in sustainability and recycling

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

In this Unit, Evidence Requirements are as follows.

Evidence will be primarily observational and physical in nature. Evidence may be presented for individual Outcomes or it may be gathered for the Unit as a whole through combining assessment in one single activity. If the latter approach is used, it must be clear how the evidence covers each Outcome.

For this Unit, learners will be required to provide evidence of:

- ◆ knowledge and understanding of a variety of woodworking and/or metalworking materials
- ◆ the ability to cut, shape, fix and join a selected range of materials (metal and/or wood) using appropriate craft techniques
- ◆ knowledge and understanding of good practice in sustainability and recycling in a practical craft context

Learners at Access 3 are expected to require a reasonable level of guidance and support throughout practical activities.

Exemplification of assessment will be provided in the *National Assessment Resource*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit. The skills that learners will be expected to improve on and develop through the Unit are based on SQA's *Skills Framework: Skills for Learning, Skills for Life and Skills for Work* and drawn from the main skills areas listed below.
