



FINAL REMINDER FOR STUDENTS HOPING TO RECEIVE EXAM RESULTS ELECTRONICALLY

The Scottish Qualifications Authority is issuing a final reminder to students hoping to receive examination results by text and email that they have to register for the MySQA service.

Students hoping to make use of this service – which was trialed successfully last year – must have registered their details by 5.00pm on Thursday (July 16) or they will miss out on electronic delivery.

The SQA is also keen to remind students who have already registered for MySQA that, if they have not already done so, then they must activate their accounts by 5.00pm on Friday July 24. If candidates have registered but have not activated their account then they will not benefit from the text and/or emails opportunity.

To date, some 46,800 students have registered with MySQA and of those some 38,000 have activated their accounts. Last year when the service was offered for the first time, some 25,500 students registered with 21,000 activating their accounts enabling them to receive electronic result notification.

Results Day this year is on Wednesday, August 5. All 160,000 students awaiting National Qualification results will receive these results by postal delivery in the normal way. However, one of the services offered by MySQA, which is accessed through the SQA website – www.sqa.org.uk – is delivery of results by text and/or email between 8.00am – 9.00am. This is particularly useful for students who might be away from home on August 5 and unable to receive postal delivery.
