

Show Racism the Red Card Creative Competition 2012: frequently asked questions

Q. What does it cost to enter the competition?

A. Entry is free of charge.

Q. Where can I get stimulus materials that will help me contextualise racism issues for my class?

A. Show Racism the Red Card produces education packs and DVDs that can assist. You can get further details by e-mailing support@theredcardscotland.org, or visiting www.theredcardscotland.org/resources. Information is also available on Glow.

Q. Does the competition have any direct links with the Curriculum for Excellence?

A. The competition has been mapped to the aims and competences of Curriculum for Excellence. You can also get information on the Curriculum for Excellence at www.sqa.org.uk/sqa/34714.html

Q. Do the entries need to be about football?

A. No, the competition is about anti-racism and anti-sectarianism, you do not need to include a football related theme in the creative work but feel free to use this theme if it helps in teaching and referencing anti-racism and anti-sectarianism messages to the class. Entrants could also be encouraged to consider creative work related to:

- Islamophobia
- welcoming new Scots
- asylum seekers/migrants myth-busting
- dealing with racism or sectarianism
- promoting Scotland as a multi-faith and multicultural society

Q. Is the creative input restricted to the topics suggested?

A. No, you can submit a creative entry from any area of the curriculum, as long as it meets the formal requirements of the competition rules.

Q. What are the prizes?

A. Prizes will be for winning individuals or groups and not for schools/colleges. Prizes will be football-related.

Q. What recognition will the school/college receive?

A. All schools and colleges which submit entries will receive a commemorative certificate to display on their premises. Winning entries will attract significant media coverage generated by SRtRC.

Q. Why are entries submitted to SQA?

A. SQA is one of the campaign supporters and, as part of its corporate social responsibility activities, is providing the administrative support to the competition.

Q. Who will judge the entries?

A. SRtRC will appoint judges who can look at the creative and technical inputs of the entries.

Q. Where will the competition finals be held?

A. The winners will be announced at a spectacular prize-giving ceremony to be held at Hampden Park, Glasgow in Spring 2012.
