### General Listening (2005)

#### Examples of the Extraneous Rule

NB For the extraneous rule to apply, the candidate must have exceeded the total number of items for which points are awarded and the additional information given must be wrong. The maximum deduction per question/sub-question for extraneous material is 1 mark.

#### General Listening: Question 8

Example 1 He visited distilleries in the Highlands and has a large collection of whisky.

Example 2 He's been to four whisky factories. He's got a big collection of whisky and he drinks it with his friends.

Example 3 He's visited four distilleries and he gives bottles to his friends.

Example 4 He's visited the Highlands and he likes the distilleries. He sometime buys a bottle for a friend.

Example 5 He had a big collection of whisky and he gave a bottle to his friend.

Example 6 He's worked in distilleries. He has a large collection of whisky and he's received bottles from his friends.

Example 1      First statement insufficient; second statement correct.      = 1 point

Example 2      First statement correct; second statement correct; third statement wrong.  
Extraneous rule applies. Deduct 1 point.      = 1 point

Example 3      Two correct statements.      = 2 points

Example 4      First statement insufficient; second statement correct; third statement  
correct.      = 2 points

Example 5      First statement correct; second statement wrong.      = 1 point

Example 6      First statement wrong; second statement correct; third statement wrong.  
Extraneous rule applies. Deduct 1 point.      = 0 points

tick (✓) and write a capital letter E beside it.
