### Accommodation Arrangements

This form is to be completed in accordance with the following instructions and notes. This form should **not** be returned to SQA but should be retained in the centre and completed once details about accommodation requirements are known. It is then to be used by the SQA Co-ordinator and the Chief Invigilator to assist with the compilation of invigilation requirements and the allocation of duties to invigilators, and subsequently the completion of an *Invigilation Provisional Requirements* form. Please refer to the accompanying circular for further details.

Details of arrangements for the accommodation outwith the presenting centre of individual candidates or of groups of candidates in certain subjects or papers should be notified to SQA by separate letter. (Please write to Sandra Bonilla, Exam Support Officer, Ironmills Road, Dalkeith, EH22 1LE.)

Centres should enter the appropriate details for Standard Grade Art and Design Practical examinations. These examinations must be held within the period **Monday 21 April to Friday 2 May inclusive**, unless written approval has otherwise been granted.

### Instructions

- 1 Enter the number of candidates in the appropriate column alongside the papers concerned. The number must include FE and adult candidates where appropriate.
- 2 Enter the number to be accommodated in each room (include details of instances where candidates with Assessment Arrangements require separate accommodation).
- 3 Enter the total number of rooms in use. This should be the maximum number of rooms in use at any one time during each morning or afternoon session. Each room to be used should be identified uniquely throughout the examination period eg A for Library, B for Assembly Hall, T1 for Technical Room. The same identification symbols should not be used for different rooms on different days.
- 4 Calculate and enter, in the appropriate column, the number of invigilators required. The number should be calculated on the following basis:

One invigilator for each room used for the examinations, but, when the number of candidates to be examined in one room exceeds 35, one invigilator for each multiple of 35 candidates or part thereof. When five or more invigilators, including the Chief, are required on any day or part-day an extra invigilator should be included in order that the Chief Invigilator may be free for overall supervision. Where there are 10 or more invigilators on duty at any time, one of the invigilators should act as a Depute (but still invigilate) but where there are 15 or more invigilators on duty the Depute should **not** invigilate but should be kept free to assist the Chief with supervision. In this case, an additional invigilator will be required.



## Notes

- 1 In the interests of economy centres should use as few rooms as possible, particularly when accommodating candidates taking examinations which start at the same time.
- 2 When accommodating in the same room examinations with different finishing times account must be taken of possible disturbance by early finishers of those still working. It is desirable that all candidates being examined at the same level in a course should be seated in the same room. If this is not possible it should be ensured that, to facilitate the use of Attendance Registers by invigilators, candidates whose names appear on the same form are not separated.
- 3 In any case where approval has been given for candidates to be examined at times other than those indicated in the prescribed timetable, the proposed arrangements should be clearly indicated against the examination paper(s) concerned and the Chief Invigilator advised accordingly. (Space has been provided against the examinations most likely to be affected.) If, at a later date, any such arrangements are found to be unnecessary the Chief Invigilator should again be informed in order that the invigilation arrangements can be amended where appropriate.
- 4 Examinations in subjects marked\* should be held in a practical room or other suitable room separate from the main examination room. The possibility of noisy operations in these rooms affecting candidates in other rooms should be considered when accommodation arrangements are made.
- 5 Examinations marked \*\* are the listening comprehension tests in Modern Languages, Gaelic and English for Speakers of Other Languages which must be held in rooms separate from other examinations.
- 6 Separate invigilators can be used for morning and afternoon examinations where centres consider there is a need for an appropriate break between sessions.
- 7 Invigilators will be employed to supervise candidates only during the period of their examinations in the actual examination rooms. The supervision of candidates who are isolated because of examinations set at times other than those prescribed in the official timetable is the responsibility of the presenting authority.
