



Scottish Studies Award: Approval and Entries

Guidance for Centres

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1 Approval to deliver the Scottish Studies Award

Schools and colleges are required to submit a *Qualification Approval Application* form only if you wish to deliver the *Scottish Studies Award* at SCQF levels 4, 5 and/or 6 (the Award is auto approved at SCQF levels 2 and 3).

The type of information we need you to provide will depend on which Units you choose to offer as part of the Award. This is because almost all of the Units are already 'auto approved'.

A list of all auto approved Units is included in *Appendix 1*. A list of Units which are not auto approved is included in *Appendix 2*. When applying for approval please follow method **A** or **B** below, as relevant to your centre.

Method A — If ALL Units you are using are on the auto approved list (see Appendix 1)

If you are delivering the *Scottish Studies Award* with Units that are all 'auto approved' please complete:

- **SECTIONS 1–6 ONLY** of the *Qualification Approval Application* form
and
- tell us on the form which Units you will be offering in your first year

OR

Method B — If at least one Unit you are using is NOT on the auto approved list (see Appendix 2)

If you are delivering the *Scottish Studies Award* and using any Units that are **NOT** 'auto approved' please complete:

- **ALL SECTIONS** of the [Qualification Approval Application](#) form
– and
- please indicate in Section 6 of the form all the Units you will be offering in your first year and indicate which Units are not auto approved. You will only need to provide information in **sections 7–12** for the Unit/s that is/are not auto approved.
and
- Supporting Document: [Staff Qualifications and Experience form](#) — one of these forms needs to be completed for each member of staff who will be delivering or assessing and internally verifying the Units which are **not** auto approved. There must be at least one assessor and one Internal Verifier for the Units.

Your SQA Co-ordinator will be able to provide you with the relevant forms and assistance. Alternatively, you can contact your SQA [Business Development Manager](#).

2 Entering candidates for the Award

Once you have gained approval for the Award you can begin delivering to candidates. You should enter your candidates for the Units that are contributing to their *Scottish Studies Award*, and then for the full Award itself, in one of the following ways:

Method 1

Use this method if the optional Units that are contributing to the *Scottish Studies Award*, **are also** contributing to other National Qualifications (eg *National Courses*, including *Skills for Work Courses*, other *Awards* or *National Progression Awards*):

1. Enter candidates for the optional Units you are using to contribute to the Award along with their entries for the other National Qualifications to which these Units are contributing. For example, if you are delivering the National 4 *English: Analysis and Evaluation in a Scottish Context* Unit and want this to contribute to both the *Scottish Studies Award* and the National 4 *English Course*, you should enter the candidates for the Unit along with their entry for the National 4 *English Course*.
2. Enter candidates for the mandatory *Scottish Studies: Scotland in Focus* Unit as a freestanding Unit.
3. Once you know at which level candidates are likely to achieve the Award, enter them for the *Scottish Studies Award* at that level *.

Method 2

Use this method if the optional Units that are contributing to the *Scottish Studies Award* are **not** contributing to any other National Qualification:

1. Enter candidates for the optional Units as freestanding Units.
2. Enter candidates for the mandatory *Scottish Studies: Scotland in Focus* Unit as a freestanding Unit.
3. Once you know at which level candidates are likely to achieve the Award, enter them for the *Scottish Studies Award* at that level *.

* The **overall level achieved** will be the same as the lowest level the candidate has achieved for any of the contributing Units. For example, if a candidate has achieved two optional Units and the mandatory Unit at SCQF level 5 but the third optional Unit at SCQF level 4, they will have achieved their *Scottish Studies Award* at SCQF level 4.

3 Verification of the Scotland in Focus Unit — H3YP

The *Scotland in Focus* Unit is internally assessed and subject to external verification by SQA through visiting verification which normally takes place in April/May each year. Verification can take place on complete and incomplete evidence. You will be notified by SQA if your centre has been selected for verification in a particular year.

Appendix 1: Auto Approved Units in the Scottish Studies Award

All of the Units listed below are auto approved for schools and colleges. If you are only using any of these Units to contribute to the *Scottish Studies Award* you should follow **Method A** in the guidance when applying for approval. If you are using Units which are not on this list you should follow **Method B**.
