



Art and Design: Expressive Activity with a Scottish Context (National 3)

SCQF: level 3 (9 SCQF credit points)

Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to develop learners' ability to express themselves creatively in response to appropriate Scottish stimuli. In this Unit, learners will produce drawings, studies and expressive work at a basic level. They will describe how art materials, techniques and/or technology have been used by artists, and consider the things that influenced and inspired the Scottish artist's work.

On completion of the Unit, learners will be able to use a variety of art materials, basic techniques and/or technology when developing their personal thoughts and ideas in 2D and/or 3D formats.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Describe an artist's work and the things that inspired it
- 2 Develop personal ideas for expressive art

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the National 3 Art and Design Course, an optional unit within the Scottish Studies Award at SCQF level 3 and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes*, which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work.

- 2.3 Selecting and using a variety of art materials, basic techniques and/or technology to represent their subject matter
- 2.4 Developing compositions and expressive art work in 2D and/or 3D formats
- 2.5 Reflecting, with some support, on their expressive art work

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

In this Unit, Evidence Requirements are as follows.

Evidence will be a combination of practical, written, oral and/or recorded evidence.

Evidence may be presented for individual Outcomes or it may be gathered for the Unit as a whole through combining assessment holistically in one single activity. If the latter approach is used, it must be clear how the evidence covers each Outcome.

In this Unit, learners will be required to provide evidence of:

- a basic understanding of a Scottish artist's influences and inspiration and their use of materials, techniques and/or technology
- the ability to produce observational drawings, studies and expressive work in response to given Scottish stimuli
- skills in using art materials, basic techniques and composition to develop expressive art work
- the ability to present basic facts and opinions about their own work and the work of another Scottish artist

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit. The skills that learners will be expected to improve on and develop through the Unit are based on SQA's *Skills Framework: Skills for Learning, Skills for Life and Skills for Work* and drawn from the main skills areas listed below. These must be built into the Unit where there are appropriate opportunities.
