7	National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher	Members were provided with the draft National 5 Course Report and HR provided a rationale for the adjustment made to the duration of the exam from 2015 onwards. Members sought clarification of the sampling of the mandatory content and it was noted that a maximum of three out of four issues of mandatory content will be sampled in each context.		
		As the new Higher History Question Paper combines the current Papers 1 (essays) and 2 (sources), it was queried whether centres would be given a breakdown of candidates' marks for their essays and sources. It was confirmed that a breakdown of only the Question Paper and Assignment will be provided.
