### Graded Unit purpose

This Graded Unit is designed to provide evidence that the learner has achieved the following principal aims of the HND Horticulture with Plantsmanship:

- ◆ to develop knowledge of taxonomy, ecology, conservation, cultivation and management of plants
- ◆ to focus on the design, management and interpretation of plant collections
- ◆ to develop knowledge of the science underpinning plant systematics and plant growth
- ◆ to apply plantsmanship skills in a management and scientific context

## Higher National Examination-based Graded Unit Specification: Designing the examination and assessing learners

**Graded Unit title:** Horticulture with Plantsmanship:  
Graded Unit 3 (SCQF level 8)

### Assessment

This Graded Unit will be assessed by the use of a *closed-book examination* developed by centres. The examination should provide the learner with the opportunity to produce evidence that demonstrates she/he has met the aims of this Graded Unit.

The assessment is an examination lasting three hours and will consist of six questions from which the learner must attempt four questions (each question being worth a maximum of 25 marks).

The examination should be designed to assess the learner's critical knowledge and understanding of the topics relating to the specific aims which this Graded Unit is designed to cover.

The examination will be marked out of **100**. Only whole marks should be used.

The questions and corresponding marks should be designed in accordance with the key topics (ie the critical knowledge and skills to be covered in the examination), level of demand (eg description, explanation, analysis, application) and relative mark allocation for each key topic outlined in the table below.

### Conditions of assessment

The examination is *closed-book* and will consist of six questions from which the learner must attempt four questions.

Reasonable assistance is the term used by SQA to describe the difference between providing learners with some direction to generate the required evidence for assessment and providing too much support which would compromise the integrity of the assessment. Reasonable assistance is part of all learning and teaching processes.

In relation to the assessment of Higher National Examination-based Graded Units, assessors may provide advice and guidance on examination technique and clarification on the meaning of command words which may appear within an examination paper, prior to the formal examination.

Remediation is not allowed in Examination-based Graded Unit assessments.

The examination should be unseen and the assessment should be conducted in controlled and invigilated conditions.

At all times, the security, integrity and confidentiality of the examination must be ensured.

### Assessing and grading learners

Learners who meet the minimum Evidence Requirements will have their achievement graded as an A, B or C. The Grade Related Criteria to be used to judge learner performance for this Graded Unit is specified in the following table.

The marks achieved by the learner in the examination should be aggregated to arrive at an overall mark for the examination. Assessors will then assign an overall grade to the learner for this Graded Unit based on the following grade boundaries.

- A = 70%–100%
- B = 60%–69%
- C = 50%–59%

These grade boundaries are fixed and should **not** be amended.

Any learner who has failed their Higher National Examination-based Graded Unit or wishes to upgrade their award must be given a re-assessment opportunity, or in exceptional circumstances, two re-assessment opportunities. This must be done by using a substantially different examination.

The final grading given must reflect the quality of the learner's evidence at the time of the completion of the graded unit. Learners must be awarded the highest grade achieved, whether through first sitting or through any re-assessment.

### **Guidance on approaches to delivery and assessment of this Graded Unit**

The closed-book examination should consist of six extended response questions, from which the learner will be required to select four. Each question should assess the learner's ability to integrate the knowledge and skills they have developed across more than one Unit or specific subject. As learners will be selecting four from six questions it is important, as far as is possible, to ensure that questions are equally weighted in terms of length of response required and level of demand.

The overall exam will be marked on the basis of 100 marks, with each question contributing 25% of the overall mark. A significant focus in marking should be on the ability of the learner to integrate the knowledge and skills gained across a number of Units and apply it in a coherent way in various horticultural contexts.

Where re-assessment is required this must be based on a significantly different exam paper.

The exam should be conducted under normal closed-book invigilated conditions.

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## General information for learners

### **Graded Unit title:** Horticulture with Plantsmanship: Graded Unit 3 (SCQF level 8)

The HND Horticulture with Plantsmanship: Graded Unit 3 consists of a closed-book exam which you will undertake under normal exam conditions. You will be presented with six questions from which you will be required to select four questions to answer. The questions will be designed to allow you to demonstrate that you achieved the following aims of the HND to:

- ◆ develop skills and knowledge in the production of edible and non-edible crop plants
- ◆ develop practical skills and knowledge in the care, maintenance and management of plants in the amenity landscape
- ◆ develop abilities in horticultural science and technology
- ◆ apply knowledge in a management and scientific context

The examination will last 3 hours and will be marked out of a total of 100 marks, with each question contributing a maximum of 25 marks. A total of 50 marks are required to achieve the Graded Unit (C Grade), with a B Grade achieved at 60 marks and an A Grade at 70. The assessment for the Graded Unit will take place towards the end of your HND year.
