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## Fashion and Textile Technology: Fashion/Textile Item Development (National 3)

**SCQF:** level 3 (6 SCQF credit points)

**Unit code:** H24X 73

### Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is for learners to explore fashion/textile trends and the fashion/textile item development process. They will work, with support, to given briefs to identify solutions for basic fashion/textile items based on those trends. Learners will follow given work sequences to make basic fashion/textile items, to an appropriate standard of quality, which takes into account fashion/textile trends. The Unit also provides learners with the opportunity to select and use equipment and tools safely.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Identify solutions for basic fashion/textile items that take into account fashion/textile trends
- 2 Make basic fashion/textile items that take into account fashion/textile trends

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the National 3 Practical Fashion and Textile Technology Course and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes* which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work. Exemplification of the standards in this Unit is given in the *Unit Assessment Support*.

  - 2.4 Making a basic fashion/textile item according to the solution, to an appropriate standard of quality

## Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

Evidence may be presented for individual Outcomes or it may be gathered for the Unit as a whole by integrating assessment in a single assessment event. If the latter approach is used, it must be clear how the evidence covers each Outcome.

For Outcome 2, learners are required to make a completed fashion/textile item that takes into account a fashion/textile trend.

Exemplification of assessment is provided in the *Unit Assessment Support*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.
