Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to provide learners with the opportunity to develop talking and writing skills in familiar contexts. Learners develop the skills needed to produce simple texts in both written and oral forms.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Participate actively in simple spoken activities in Gaelic
- 2 Produce simple written texts in Gaelic

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the National 3 Gàidhlig Course and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes*, which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work. Exemplification of the standards in this Unit is given in *Unit Assessment Support*.

Outcomes and assessment standards

Outcome 1

The learner will:

- 1 Participate actively in simple spoken activities in Gaelic **by:**
 - 1.1 Selecting ideas and content, using a simple format and structure, appropriate to purpose and audience
 - 1.2 Applying knowledge of language in terms of language choice
 - 1.3 Communicating meaning at first hearing
 - 1.4 Using some aspects of non-verbal communication

Outcome 2

The learner will:

- 2 **Produce simple written texts in Gaelic by:**
 - 2.1 Selecting ideas and content, using a simple format and structure, appropriate to purpose and audience
 - 2.2 Applying knowledge of language in terms of language choice and technical accuracy
 - 2.3 Communicating meaning at first reading

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

Each language mode should be given equal weighting in assessment.

For this Unit, learners will be required to provide evidence of their talking and writing skills by producing:

- ◆ at least one spoken activity using simple language
- ◆ at least one written text using simple language

Evidence should be gathered in combination with other Outcomes where possible, either from this Unit or in combination with the Outcomes from the *Gàidhlig: Understanding Language* (National 3) and *Gàidhlig: Literacy* (National 3) Units. Evidence may also be gathered for individual Outcomes where appropriate.

Exemplification of assessment is provided in *Unit Assessment Support*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit. The skills that learners will be expected to improve on and develop through the Unit are based on SQA's *Skills Framework: Skills for Learning, Skills for Life and Skills for Work* and drawn from the main skills areas listed below. These must be built into the Unit where there are appropriate opportunities.
