-DESCRIPTION-

Type and Purpose

A <u>specialist</u> module which enables the student to finish traditional upholstery.

Preferred Entry Level 05407: Traditional Upholstery Preparation. 05409: Materials for Traditional Upholstery.

05607: Machine and Hand Sewing for Soft Furnishing.

Learning Outcomes

The student should:

- 1. select suitable covering materials for a given project;
- 2. apply principles of measuring, planning and cutting of covering materials;
- 3. apply appropriate methods of finishing and closing;
- 4. comply with regulations and procedures and use safe working practices specified for equipment and work areas.

Content/

Corresponding to the Learning Outcomes:

- 1. factors affecting selection of suitable material e.g. durability, cost, colour, etc, of tapestry, brocade, brocatelles, etc.
- methods of measuring, planning and cutting materials, use of suitable tools, seam allowance, allowance for pattern, preparation of cutting list, quantities of materials required, templates.
- 3. knowledge and appreciation of:
 - (a) closing methods: zippers, velcro, fringes, gimps, braids, braiding and nails, close nailing, buttons and studs;

- (b) finishing methods: piping, welting, quilting, rucking, slip stitching, back stitching and buttoning.
- 4. safety precautions and regulations relevant to tools, equipment, behaviour and work.

Suggested Learning and Teaching Approaches

It is envisaged that the general teaching approach will be activity/workshop based and student centred.

The learning programme should interest the student and relate to a theme or vocational bias.

Critical skills and techniques should be demonstrated prior to student involvement.

Posters, information sheets, worksheets, workfiles, slides, films and video may be used to enhance the learning environment and process.

A set of completed exercises should be available for students to work to and compare standards.

Safety, safe working practices, care and use of equipment should be an integral part of all module activities.

Assessment Procedures

All Learning Outcomes must be validly assessed.

The student must be informed of the tasks which contribute to summative assessment. Any unsatisfactory aspects of performance should, if possible, be discussed with the student as and when they arise.

Acceptable performance in the module will be satisfactory achievement of the performance criteria specified for each Learning Outcome.
