



# IT Solutions for Administrators (National 3)

## **Unit outline**

The general aim of this Unit is to develop learners' awareness of administration in the workplace and to complete simple administrative tasks. The Unit also aims to enable learners to acquire IT skills in familiar administration-related contexts. Learners will use basic functions of the following IT applications — word processing, spreadsheets and databases — to create and edit simple documents used in the workplace, which may relate to any administrative function.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Use basic spreadsheet functions
- 2 Use basic database functions
- 3 Use basic word processing functions

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the National 3 Administration and IT Course and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes*, which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work.
