Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to provide learners with the opportunity to develop and extend listening and reading skills. Learners develop the skills needed to understand, analyse and evaluate a wide range of detailed and complex texts in the contexts of literature, language, media and culture.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Understand, analyse and evaluate detailed and complex spoken Gaelic language
- 2 Understand, analyse and evaluate detailed and complex written Gaelic texts

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

For this Unit, learners will be required to provide evidence of their listening and reading skills by:

- ◆ understanding, analysing and evaluating at least one detailed and complex spoken Gaelic language activity
- ◆ understanding, analysing and evaluating at least one detailed and complex written Gaelic text

Evidence should be gathered in combination with other Outcomes where possible, either from this Unit or in combination with the Outcomes from the *Gàidhlig: Creation and Production* (Higher) Unit. Evidence may also be gathered for individual Outcomes where appropriate.

Assessment evidence gathered for this Unit must come from at least one of the following contexts: literature, language, media or culture.

Exemplification of assessment is provided in Unit Assessment Support. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit.
