Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to provide learners with the opportunity to develop the advanced language skills needed to understand, analyse and evaluate in depth complex literary texts in Latin and in English translation. Learners also develop knowledge and understanding of aspects of Roman culture.

For this Unit, learners will be required to provide evidence of understanding, analysing and evaluating in depth a range of complex verse and/or prose texts partly in Latin and partly translated into English. Learners will be required to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of a wide range of literary techniques and aspects of Roman culture.
