This unit provides the skills and knowledge required to plan and organise the movement of luggage, including gathering information regarding the volume of passenger luggage requiring transfer, and ensuring that the correct equipment is available to transport it. It includes ensuring the availability of suitable staff to transfer luggage between passenger and ship in a safe and efficient manner.

The assessment route is recommended for supervisors and other first line managers.

Assessment (evidence) requirements

You will understand the safety precautions required when carrying out the activities. You will be required to demonstrate safe working practices throughout and will understand your responsibility for taking the necessary safeguards to protect yourself and others in the workplace.
