Simulation is acceptable for:

UNIT COSBEDMO12 - Simulations are considered to be acceptable for producing evidence for the following items(s) which are considered to be rare, but key/critical to demonstrating competence.

Product Evidence:

- (1) Appeal(s) against a refusal to grant a consent
- (2) Record(s) of appeal negotiations
- (3) Record(s) of proposals which have been changed following the results of appeals

Process Evidence:

- (1) appeal negotiations

The following conditions of realism should be present

- Contingencies
- Standards and quality specifications
- Communication methods and media
- Information and data

UNIT COSBEDMO14: (Prepare performance specifications) - Simulations are considered to be acceptable for producing evidence for the following items(s) which are considered to be rare, but key/critical to demonstrating competence.

Product Evidence:

Performance specifications which includes: purpose; consistency checks; identified source information; detailed design objectives and functional performance requirements criteria; methods of assessment and verification; data used for calculations; references and cross-reference; checks and approvals
