Unit outline

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Apply language skills to investigate and report on a chosen topic in Gaelic

Outcomes and assessment standards

Outcome 1

The learner will:

- 1 Apply language skills to investigate and report on a chosen topic in Gaelic by:**
 - 1.1 Understanding straightforward written texts in Gaelic
 - 1.2 Selecting relevant information from the texts
 - 1.3 Giving an oral presentation, in Gaelic, on the topic investigated
 - 1.4 Responding orally to oral questions in Gaelic, relevant to the chosen topic

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

This Unit will be assessed through controlled assessment which meets the Evidence Requirements below.

The assessment method for this Unit will be an assignment in which the learner will apply their language skills to investigate a chosen topic in Gaelic.

For this Unit, learners will be required to provide evidence of their reading, listening and talking skills by:

- ◆ selecting relevant information from at least two written texts
- ◆ making an oral presentation in Gaelic
- ◆ responding appropriately to questions in Gaelic

Evidence can be gathered holistically for the Units or Course as a whole by combining assessment through integrated activities.

The assignment is:

- ◆ set by centres within the SQA guidelines described below
- ◆ conducted under some supervision and control

Evidence will be internally marked by centre staff in line with SQA guidelines.

All assessment is subject to quality assurance by SQA.

Setting the assessment

The assignment will be set by centres within the following guidelines:

- ◆ The learner will agree the chosen topic with the teacher/lecturer.
- ◆ The assignment will be a meaningful and appropriately challenging task, which should clearly demonstrate application of skills in Gaelic at an appropriate level.
- ◆ The teacher/lecturer will provide overall guidelines for the assignment and a list of questions/tasks/prompts which will lead learners through the assignment in clear stages.

Conducting the assessment

The assignment will be conducted under some supervision and control. This will take the form of the following:

- ◆ Learners may use a dictionary.
- ◆ Teachers/lecturers can select and provide articles and information in Gaelic, as appropriate to the learner.
- ◆ The amount of support provided should be reflected in the assessment judgment.

Judging the evidence

Evidence will be internally marked and verified by centre staff in line with SQA guidelines.

All assessment is subject to quality assurance by SQA.
