Fashion and Textile Technology: Textile Technologies (National 3)

Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to provide learners with the opportunity to develop basic knowledge and skills related to textile technologies. This includes an awareness of the characteristics and properties of a range of textiles and their uses. Learners will have the opportunity to make basic fashion/textile items, to an appropriate standard of quality, using a pattern and a range of textile construction techniques. The Unit also provides learners with the opportunity to select and use equipment and tools safely.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Prepare to make basic fashion/textile items using a pattern
- 2 Make basic fashion/textile items using a pattern

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the National 3 Fashion and Textile Technology Course and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes* which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work. Exemplification of the standards in this Unit is given in *Unit Assessment Support*.

Recommended Entry

Outcome 2

The learner will:

- 2 Make basic fashion/textile items using a pattern by:**
 - 2.1 Selecting appropriate equipment and tools to make the chosen item
 - 2.2 Using equipment and tools according to safety guidelines
 - 2.3 Making a basic fashion/textile item using the pattern and appropriate textile construction techniques, to an appropriate standard of quality

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

Evidence may be presented for individual Outcomes or it may be gathered for the Unit as a whole by integrating assessment in a single assessment event. If the latter approach is used, it must be clear how the evidence covers each Outcome.

The textile(s) selected for the item must be suitable for the purpose of the item and suitable in weight and texture. Learners must work in accordance with health and safety guidelines. For Outcome 2, learners will be required to make a complete fashion/textile item using a pattern.

Exemplification of assessment is provided in *Unit Assessment Support*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit.
