



Drama: Production Skills with a Scottish Context (National 5)

SCQF: level 5 (9 SCQF credit points)

Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to provide learners with knowledge and understanding of a range of production skills. They will use these skills to enhance drama when presenting. Learners will work with others to develop a performance concept as an actor or in a production role. They will learn how to evaluate their own work and that of other learners.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Analyse a range of production skills in drama
- 2 Apply a range of production skills in drama

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the National 5 Drama Course, an optional Unit in the Scottish Studies award at SCQF level 5 and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes*, which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

 - 2.3 Evaluating their contribution to the drama and that of others

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

Evidence will be a combination of written, oral, recorded and practical evidence. For this Unit, learners will be required to provide evidence of:

- ◆ generating ideas for a production concept which includes a Scottish theme
- ◆ analysing a range of production roles
- ◆ applying a range of production skills
- ◆ evaluating their own work and that of others

Evidence generated for this Unit must be in a Scottish context for the relevant assessment standards.

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit.
