Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to develop learners' reading, listening, writing and talking skills, in Gaelic, in a variety of forms relevant for learning, life and work. Learners will develop the ability to understand detailed ideas and information presented orally and in writing. Learners will also develop the ability to communicate ideas and information orally and in writing with technical accuracy.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Read and understand detailed Gaelic word-based texts
- 2 Listen to and understand detailed Gaelic spoken communication
- 3 Write detailed technically accurate Gaelic texts
- 4 Talk to communicate, in Gaelic, as appropriate to audience and purpose

This Unit is available as a free-standing Unit. The Unit Specification should be read in conjunction with the *Gàidhlig: Literacy (National 5) Unit Support Notes*, which provide advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches and development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work. Exemplification of the standards in this Unit is given in *Unit Assessment Support*.

- 4.1 Selecting and using detailed language
- 4.2 Organising spoken communication
- 4.3 Using a range of non-verbal conventions

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used. They should ensure that there is sufficient evidence of competence in the learner's evidence of literacy skills to allow a judgement to be made that the learner has achieved the Unit.

Evidence for this Unit will include:

For **Outcome 1**: responses to reading at least one Gaelic word-based text.

For **Outcome 2**: responses to listening in Gaelic on at least one occasion.

For **Outcome 3**: at least one Gaelic written text of more than 500 words which communicates meaning on first reading.

For **Outcome 4**: talking, individually or as part of a group discussion, in Gaelic, on at least one occasion.

Word-based texts are likely to be functional or transactional in nature.

Exemplification of assessment is provided in *Unit Assessment Support*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

The SQA *Skills Framework: Skills for Learning, Skills for Life and for Work* contains generic literacy skills. The *Gàidhlig: Literacy (National 5)* Unit is derived from this framework and learners will cover all the main literacy skills. The main literacy skills are as follows:

1 Literacy

- 1.1 Reading
- 1.2 Writing
- 1.3 Listening and talking

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit. The skills that learners will be expected to improve on and develop through the Unit are based on SQA's *Skills Framework: Skills for Learning, Skills for Life and Skills for Work* and drawn from the main skills areas listed below. These must be built into the Unit where there are appropriate opportunities.

5 Thinking skills

- 5.3 Applying
- 5.4 Analysing and evaluating

Amplification of these is given in SQA's *Skills Framework: Skills for Learning, Skills for Life and Skills for Work*. The level of these skills should be at the same SCQF level of the Unit and be consistent with the SCQF level descriptor.
