Guidance for Signposting

The Regulatory Principles (2014) signposting has been produced for reference to show (shaded area) where 2011 Principles signpost to 2014 Principles, Regulatory Principles Directives and the *Criteria for Accredited Qualifications*.

- The signposting is only relevant to Awarding Bodies approved before 2014.
- The signposting can also be used as a guide when moving documents between folders in Quickr.
- Awarding bodies are responsible for determining the currency and accuracy of their banked documentation.
- For further information on banking documents and titling convention, see the *Awarding Bodies Guide to Using Quickr*.

It should be noted that the introduction of the Regulatory Principles (2014) will replace the Regulatory Principles (2011) and the *Criteria for Accredited Qualifications documents*.

The current Regulatory Directives however will continue to apply.
