Section 2: comments on assessment

Assessment approaches

The majority of centres submitted partial evidence. Most centres submitted evidence for the Design and Manufacture: Design (National 4) unit. A few centres submitted evidence for the Design and Manufacture: Materials and Manufacturing (National 4) unit.

The assessment approach used by most centres was valid and accepted.

A few centres devised their own assessments which did not generate appropriate evidence to meet the assessment standards, and so were not accepted.

Assessment judgements

A significant number of centre assessment judgements were not accepted due to issues. These included:

- Not indicating the judgements they had made. Centres must clearly indicate which assessment standards are being assessed, judgements they have reached and what evidence is submitted, to justify the judgement.
- Submitting very little evidence, which meant that no verification activity could take place.
 Centres must not submit materials for verification until candidates have generated sufficient evidence for assessment.

Design unit

Assessment standard 1.1 — Researching design factors using a range of techniques Candidates must use more than one research technique to pass this assessment standard.

Assessment standard 2.5 — Applying modelling techniques

Candidates must apply more than one modelling technique to pass this assessment standard.

Materials and Manufacturing unit

Assessment standard 1.1 — Selecting and justifying materials to suit manufacturing tasks

Candidates must justify their selection of materials to pass this assessment standard.

Section 3: general comments

If centres create their own assessment tasks, they must provide information on what they are accepting as a pass.

Centres must indicate which parts of the evidence they are using to assess each assessment standard.

Where centres have made a judgement on an assessment standard, they must provide evidence to support this judgement.
