Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to develop skills by using sources of information to detect and explain exaggeration and selective use of facts and develop a detailed knowledge and understanding of democracy and the political system in Scotland and the United Kingdom.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 Use a range of sources of information to detect and explain exaggeration and selective use of facts relating to democracy in the Scottish and United Kingdom political systems
- 2 Draw on a detailed knowledge and understanding of democracy in the Scottish and United Kingdom political systems

Outcomes and Assessment Standards

Outcome 1

The learner will:

- 1 Use a range of sources of information to detect and explain exaggeration and selective use of facts relating to democracy in the Scottish and United Kingdom political systems by:
- 1.1 Detecting exaggeration or selective use of facts using between two and four sources of information
- 1.2 Explaining, in detail, exaggeration or selective use of facts using evidence from between two and four sources of information

Outcome 2

The learner will:

- 2 Draw on a detailed knowledge and understanding of democracy in the Scottish and United Kingdom political systems by:
- 2.1 Giving detailed descriptions of a political issue which draw on a factual and theoretical knowledge of democracy in Scotland or the United Kingdom
- 2.2 Giving detailed explanations relating to a political issue in Scotland or the United Kingdom

Evidence Requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners, to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

Evidence is required to show that the learner has met the Outcomes and Assessment Standards.

The sources of information used may be written, numerical, graphical, pictorial, audiovisual or oral.

Assessment evidence can be drawn from a variety of activities and presented in a variety of formats, including, for example, presentations, posters, brief written responses to questions and participation in group tasks. All of the evidence does not need to be from the one activity, but can be assembled from a variety of tasks and assessments carried out during the duration of the Course.

Evidence may be presented for individual Outcomes, or gathered for the Unit.

Exemplification of assessment will be provided in *Unit Assessment Support*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.

Assessment standard thresholds

If a candidate successfully meets the requirements of the specified number of Assessment Standards they will be judged to have passed the Unit overall and no further re-assessment will be required.

The specific requirements for this Unit is as follows:

• 3 out of the 4 Assessment Standards must be achieved

It should be noted that there will still be the requirement for candidates to be given the opportunity to meet all Assessment Standards. The above threshold has been put in place to reduce the volume of re-assessment where that is required.

Development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work

It is expected that learners will develop broad, generic skills through this Unit.
