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## **Diet 2019**

### **Changes to documents following Diet 2019**

#### **Higher**

#### Specimen question papers

In September 2019, we made the following amendments to the specimen question papers marking instructions to provide further clarity:

- ♦ In the Classical Literature specimen question paper, question 1(a) or (b) *Discuss a theme in classical literature*, we have removed the wording 'in some instances unclearly expressed or inaccurate' from the 5–6 marks range for 'Use of knowledge'.
- ◆ In the Classical Literature and the Classical Society specimen question papers, in the question Compare a modern source/quote with a classical idea(s), the wording 'identifies relevant points' has replaced 'interprets relevant points' to clarify that the skill is comparing a modern source with classical ideas. The wording 'Award 2 marks' has changed to 'Award up to 2 marks' to clarify that candidates can be awarded 1 mark.

#### Coursework assessment task

Typographical change made to the detailed marking instructions. In D Analysis and evaluating, for the 11–12 mark range, the wording 'illustrates there is change and continuity and/or ranges of experiences' has changed to 'illustrates there is change and continuity and ranges of experiences'. This is to clarify that candidates should discuss both change and continuity, and a range of experiences for this full mark range.

Please ensure candidates use the current, published coursework assessment tasks. The Higher Classical Studies specimen question papers and coursework assessment task are available on the Higher Classical Studies subject page.

#### Course reports

Please read the annual course reports for Classical Studies. We produce these reports following the exam diet and they provide information on how candidates performed in course assessment for National Qualifications.

Course reports include a summary of areas candidates performed well in and areas candidates found demanding. They also contain advice on preparing candidates for future assessment, and statistical data relating to grade boundaries. ## National 5 question paper

From session 2020–21, for Section 2 — Classical Literature, 'text' will replace 'text(s)'. For example questions 7(a) and 8(a) will read 'Describe ... in a classical text.'

- select a question or issue that allows a challenge or counter argument
- focus on primary evidence which allows more opportunity for discussion
