Bus

Train

Dalmarnoch and Bridgeton stations are around a 15 minute walk away (connect via Glasgow Central or Argyle Street station) from Celtic Park and Bellgrove station is around a 20 minute walk away (connect via Queen Street station). Glasgow Central, Glasgow Queen Street and Argyle Street stations all have connecting bus routes to Celtic Park.

Celtic Park is situated to the south west of Glasgow city centre, within close proximity of M74 and M8. Exit at junctions 12, 13 or 14 of M8.
