



Personal Development: Self Awareness (SCQF level 6) Unit

Unit outline

The general aim of this Unit is to allow candidates to build confidence and self-esteem and develop self-awareness, through self-evaluation of their own qualities, feelings, achievements, and areas of development, while undertaking a personal project with non-directive supervision.

Learners who complete this Unit will be able to:

- 1 prepare for a project to develop self-awareness
- 2 carry out the project
- 3 review knowledge of self

This Unit is a mandatory Unit of the Personal Development Award at SCQF level 6 and is also available as a free-standing Unit. The *Unit Specification* should be read in conjunction with the *Unit Support Notes*, which provides advice and guidance on delivery, assessment approaches, and development of skills for learning, skills for life, and skills for work. Exemplification of the standards in this Unit is given in *Unit Assessment Support*.

Recommended entry

Entry to this Unit is at the discretion of the centre. However, learners would normally be expected to have attained the skills, knowledge, and understanding required by one or more of the following or equivalent qualifications and/or experience:

Outcomes and assessment standards

Outcome 1

The learner will:

1 Prepare for a project to develop self-awareness by:

- 1.1 evaluating their own qualities and feelings, using an appropriate technique
- 1.2 gathering opinions from another person about own qualities
- 1.3 identifying, and explaining the choice of, an aim for the project
- 1.4 identifying, and explaining the choice of, their own complex tasks to enable progress towards the aim

Outcome 2

The learner will:

2 Carry out the project by:

- 2.1 monitoring progress and explaining any appropriate action taken
- 2.2 completing their own identified tasks

Outcome 3

The learner will:

3 Review knowledge of self by:

- 3.1 analysing progress made towards achieving the aim of the project
- 3.2 reaching conclusions about what has been learned about their own qualities and feelings based on this analysis
- 3.3 reaching conclusions about personal goals for further development of selfawareness

Evidence requirements for the Unit

Assessors should use their professional judgement, subject knowledge and experience, and understanding of their learners to determine the most appropriate ways to generate evidence and the conditions and contexts in which they are used.

Assessment evidence can be drawn from a variety of sources and presented in a variety of formats. The evidence does not need to be achieved in one activity, but can be assembled from a variety of tasks and assessments undertaken throughout the Award. Evidence may be presented for individual Outcomes or gathered for the Unit or Award as a whole by combining assessment holistically in one single activity.

• Learners should be given templates to ensure they have the opportunity to record achievement for all Outcomes and Assessment Standards.

- Learners should keep records of their activities and tasks throughout the project.
- ◆ Learner work should be confirmed by the teacher/lecturer as meeting the relevant Assessment Standard.

Exemplification of assessment will be provided in *Unit Assessment Support*. Advice and guidance on possible approaches to assessment is provided in the *Unit Support Notes*.
