# Changes to assessment in National 5 Geography

# **Question Paper**

#### Can they be asked about a combined indicator, eg HDI?

It is unlikely that combined indicators would appear in a National 5 paper.

#### You mention testing PRESENTING information in the Global Issues section. What form would this take? I don't believe I've seen this in a question paper at National 5 before.

It might include a candidate drawing a diagram within their answer, eg Natural Hazards.

# When required to draw diagrams, can candidates use pencil or do they need to draw in pen?

Preferably pen as the scripts are scanned for marking.

# Please can you give us an idea of the type of thing you would be expecting from pupils to gain marks in the 'patterns' map work questions?

The Specimen Question Paper has examples.

#### Can you tell us whether there will be questions which have a higher mark allocation than we have already seen, or is it a case that the question mark allocation is the same but just a wider coverage?

There will be wider sampling of the course content. Questions will be worth a maximum of 6 marks.

# Can you confirm that pupils have to know about a specific case study and their movement through the demographic transition model (DTM) at National 5? It appears in the Specimen Question Paper.

The DTM question may be set in context – as in the Specimen Question Paper. It may be helpful to candidates to have the DTM set in context by teaching a case study.

# Could you please outline some examples of recent developments in developed world cities?

Changes in transport and developments in the rural urban fringe.

Just to clarify, do we teach just one conflict and management case study? Or do we teach a case study for both landscapes studied, eg Dorset conflicts and solutions along with Cairngorms conflicts and solutions?

One case study.

Would they ever be required to draw a graph from given information? No.

## What needs to be taught in the Natural Regions Section?

The Course Specification has the mandatory content.

### The Specimen Question Paper looks like it had more 6 mark questions than previous papers? Is this a likely trend?

It could vary from year to year - there are more marks available.

# Assignment

## Can assignments be typed up (including by candidates without additional assessment arrangements) if under the same 1hr etc conditions?

Yes, but you must make sure they cannot access any other information on pen drives, internet etc.

### Can I give them the aim for their assignment if we gather data as a group?

They should have collected enough data so that they have a choice of aim.

### Please can you clarify what you mean when you say 'no feedback on drafts'? The guidance clearly says 'no detailed feedback'.

Feedback should not be given on practice write-ups.

# Although you are not allowed to mark or give detailed feedback, are you allowed to give verbal advice to students on how to improve their work?

Yes, on a whole class basis – generically.

#### Can you clarify that we are not allowed to direct pupils to resources in any way? Some pupils need advice on appropriate resources for National 5 and where to access these.

You cannot direct them to specific resources.

You cannot ensure a whole class will not all choose the same aim: you cannot stop them talking about it outside of class. Would it be acceptable to give them a choice of aims or do they have to come up with their own? If so, it is entirely possible they will all decide on the same one.

It is reasonable to give them a range of topics to choose from but they should come up with their own aim.
