## Phonographic Performance Ltd (PPL) vs. Thomas Morrough

The Case: Thomas Morrough, owner of the restaurant Cube, hired his premises out to a third party. The third party then booked a DJ to play music at their private party at the restaurant.
PPL (Phonographic Performance Ltd) filed a copyright infringement lawsuit against Thomas Morrough as he did not possess the PPL and PRS (Performing Rights Society) 'Music License' to allow him to legally play recorded music in his business premises.
The Outcome: Thomas Morrough argued that the third party hiring a DJ to play at his restaurant did not infringe copyright as he had no control over what songs were being played. The judge ruled that the owner of the premises, not the DJ, was responsible for obtaining ‘The Music License’ from PPL/PRS. Thomas Morrough was fined $£ 2,500$.
