(d) During the fourth playing your teacher will indicate with a snap or a tap where bar 3 begins. The first two notes in bar three are crotchet notes. What is the value of the third note? [1 mark]
(e) During the fifth playing your teacher will indicate with a snap or a tap where bar 5 begins. Name the interval between the first two notes of bar 5. [1 mark]
