**Source A** is from a modern writer discussing leadership.

Leadership is usually linked to people in positions of power because their status gives them authority over others. Leaders can be individuals or groups. Some inherit their position because they have been born into a ruling family which passes this position down through the generations. Some have power because of their achievements in war, others because of their intelligence or cunning. The authority of some leaders is total since they make the rules and expect everyone to obey without question. Disobedience can lead to punishment, torture or even death. This dictatorial style is not acceptable in the UK today because leaders are expected to use their authority to follow the will of the people who have chosen them. They must also respect non-political leaders such as leaders of pressure groups or religious figures as they often represent what people believe is right.

2. Compare this modern view of leadership to views of leadership in any classical text(s) you have studied.
