Choose one of the following two scenarios.

**SCENARIO 1: Learning**

Recently you went on an adventure holiday to the south of France where you were able to try out new sports and activities. On your return you were asked to write an account of your experience, in **French**, for your school/college website.

**You must include** the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- who you went with **and** what the journey was like
- what you thought of the area where you stayed
- what you liked/disliked about the sports/activities you learned to do
- what places you visited in the area
- what you learned from your experience
- whether or not you will continue to do the new sports/activities you learned to do.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.

**OR**

**SCENARIO 2: Culture**

Recently you were on holiday in France. The small town where you were staying was holding its annual summer festival. On your return you were asked to write an account of your experience, in **French**, for your school/college website.

**You must include** the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- where exactly you were in France **and** who you were with
- what you thought of the town/surrounding area
- how you found out about the festival
- what you did during the festival
- what you enjoyed most/least about the festival
- whether you would like to attend a similar event in the future.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.
