Award Title: Professional Development Award in Computer Support at SCQF¹ Level 7

Introduction to the Award

This Professional Development Award (PDA) is one of a suite which was designed to incorporate the knowledge and understanding required by popular vendor awards² into SQA's Higher National frameworks.

It has become increasing clear that it needed to be offered in a flexible format with generic units.

The units which now make up this PDA in Computer Support at SCQF Level 7 include vendor-related topics, but are generic in nature. The units are already in the HND Computing and HND Computing Networking frameworks. Including this PDA into the HN frameworks allows candidates to work towards a Higher National qualification via short courses or part-time study.

Target Audience

Vendor awards are becoming increasingly popular with both candidates and employers.

As this award covers the knowledge and understanding associated with the CompTIA A+ concepts series and is, therefore, a good introduction to either desktop support or systems administration. It covers the knowledge and understanding associated with the CompTIA A+ certification. It will be attractive to candidates who are looking for employment at an entry level position as a desktop support technician. It would also be suitable for those wanting to prepare for advancement in their organisation.

On achieving this PDA candidates would also have the knowledge and skills required to sit the CompTIA A+ examination. Successful completion of this PDA would fully prepare candidates for the CompTIA A+ examination and offers progression to higher levels of study.
