Dr Stewart reported on work being undertaken around the approach to the next academic session for both NQ and HNVQ noting that, one a position had been agreed with the working and strategic groups, this would put to the Board of Management for approval.

110/4 EVALUATION OF 2021 ACM

The Committee received a presentation delivered by Mr Ware, and highlighting key points of work undertaken to evaluate the 2021 alternative certification model (ACM).

The presentation provided an overview of the approach taken to evaluation, and the findings of the different strands of work. Ms McIntosh noted that as well as individual

reporting on each strand, a summary report would be developed and published which would provide a holistic view across the whole piece.

reported on the emerging themes from the surveys completed by both learners and practitioners and the in-depth interviews that had been undertaken to better understand the general results garnered from the surveys. Responses showed that understanding standards events had been especially welcomed by practitioners welcomed, in particular those that made use of technology and interaction. Key points, including comparative analysis across RoUK would be detailed within the final summary report.

The Committee welcomed the presentation, commenting on the quality of work. Members noted that the final report would be published on the SQA website and discussed additional ideas to disseminate the work, suggesting workshops for stakeholders based on the findings to properly interrogate the information.

The Committee endorsed the engagement with the issues within the work that would serve to improve future systems.

Mr Morrison delivered a presentation to the Committee reporting on the extensive engagement that had been undertaken with the system to reach an agreed position for National Qualifications in 2022 as an intermediary position between 2021 and awarding.
