Outcomes of effective performance

- 1. Organise work activities and the use of resources in area of your responsibility so that they
 - are efficient and effective
 - comply with legal requirements and environmental policies
 - minimise the negative and maximise the positive impact on the environment
- Identify the environmental impact of work activities and the use of resources in your area of responsibility.
- 3. Report promptly any identified risks to the environment, which you do not have the ability to control.
- 4. Encourage people in your area of responsibility to identify opportunities for, and contribute to, improving environmental performance.
- Identify and implement changes to work activities and the use of resources that will reduce the negative and increase the positive impact on the environment.
- Communicate the environmental benefits resulting from changes to work activities and the use of resources.
- Obtain specialist advice, where necessary, to help you identify and manage the environmental impact of your work activities and use of resources.

Behaviours which underpin effective performance

- 8. You recognise changes in circumstances promptly and adjust plans and activities accordingly.
- 9. You present information clearly, concisely, accurately and in ways that promote understanding.
- 10. You keep people informed of plans and developments.
- 11. You comply with, and ensure others comply with, legal requirements, industry regulations, organisational policies and professional codes.
- 12. You act within the limits of your authority.
- 13. You are vigilant for possible hazards.
- 14. You make appropriate information and knowledge available promptly to those who need it and have a right to it.

- F. How to identify and implement changes to work activities and the use of resources that will reduce their negative and increase their positive environmental impact.
- G. The principles of effective communication and how to apply them.

- Legal requirements and environmental policies and how to comply with them.
- J. The types of risks to the environment, which you do not have the ability to control.
- K. People in your area of responsibility who are able to contribute to, and identify opportunities for, improving environmental performance.
- L. The range of environmental specialists that exists inside and/or outside your organisation.
- M. Your role, responsibilities and limits of your authority.
