Research Summary: Centre Survey 2024–25

Date: November 2025

Why did we do this research?

We carry out this research every year to find out what schools, colleges and training

providers think about SQA and how well we perform, and to see if their views have

changed.

What are we trying to find out?

what schools, colleges and training providers think about how well SQA is

performing

what they think about SQA, and what words they associate with SQA

how well they think SQA is living up to commitments to change

How did we do the research?

We carried out surveys between January and March 2025 with people working in schools, colleges and training providers in Scotland, and with places offering SQA

qualifications in the UK and internationally. We received over 500 responses.

What did we learn?

Attitudes to SQA's performance were broadly similar to a year ago, with an

average score for satisfaction with SQA of 7.20 out of 10.

Most different parts of SQA's performance were also scored similarly to a year

ago.

Respondents felt that SQA did not deal with their problems as effectively as it did

a year ago.

In general, the way in which SQA was perceived was similar to last year. SQA

was seen as helpful, accessible, reliable, responsive, but also bureaucratic.

What will change because of the research?

Qualifications Scotland will replace SQA in the near future. It will be set up in a way

which further makes sure that the voices of learners and educators are heard, and

play a key part in how we make decisions. This will lead to improvements in how the

organisation performs.
