With regard to the following entry, would it be possible to say a bit more about the 'how' in plain English. Eg, can we say: At the appeals stage, teachers appointed by the SQA will not have details of the individual learner or whether they live in poverty

or not. They will offer a 'second opinion' without fear or favour by judging the learner's assessment evidence against the national standards and determining if they agree with the original grade, or whether the evidence suggests a higher or lower grade. If a learner is at risk of a lower grade, this will be carefully reviewed on an individual basis by an SQA Head of Service, and by the Chief Examiner if necessary, before the decision is finalised. In previous years the numbers of downgrades at appeals stage is exceptionally low.

Some very quick comments from myself and Gill Stewart.

I think the analysis here could be helpful for tomorrow, but let's not assume the issues away. Demand is difficult to quantify this year, because the approach is so different. Larger volumes present risk and long lead times would not be welcomed. Volumes in excess of 75,000 present very significant risk to the system and to 2022. Large volumes undermine the ACM.

I would be grateful if you could confirm that the Cabinet Secretary is sighted on both SQA papers, which look at these issues in more detail.


