The First Minister presided over an exams fiasco in 2020, that punished the poorest pupils, and here we have another one. He added: "Other authorities clearly believe that the SQA has marked its own homework and has avoided the thorough investigation that should have taken place.

"As a former education secretary, John Swinney must be upfront about what evidence there is to support what he said in Parliament. Otherwise, suspicions will continue to grow about this SNP quango, which is not fit for purpose."
