

Our organisation is committed to fostering a workplace built on the core values of dignity and respect for all. This commitment means that we recognise and value the diversity of our workforce. We believe that every employee deserves to feel safe and respected at work.

Recently the <u>Supreme Court</u> has ruled that "sex" in the Equality Act 2010 refers to biological sex. This ruling has legal implications for how the Equality Act is interpreted, particularly in relation to single-sex spaces and provisions. We acknowledge that this ruling may have significant implications for the way some services and spaces are provided. This ruling is regarded to have brought clarity to the Equality Act 2010, but we understand that this also raises complex and sensitive issues, and that it may have caused concern and uncertainty for some of our colleagues, in particular our transgender colleagues.

We are currently reviewing the implications of the Supreme Court ruling in detail. We are also awaiting further guidance from the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) on the practical application of the ruling.

We recognise that this is a complex and evolving situation and will continue to liaise with our colleagues in Scottish Government and across the public sector. We are committed to ongoing dialogue with our employee networks and union colleagues, to ensure that we are listening and addressing concerns.

We are reviewing and updating our policies, as necessary, to ensure compliance with the law and to uphold our commitment to dignity and respect for all. This review will be conducted with careful consideration and any changes will be clearly communicated.

We understand that this communication may not answer all your questions. We will provide further information and guidance as soon as it becomes available.

Thank you for your understanding and your continued commitment to making our

organisation a workplace where everyone feels valued and respected.
