
What is a digital question paper?

A digital question paper is an electronic version of the question paper that can be completed using a PC, laptop, or tablet.


Digital question papers are identical to the paper versions of the question papers and are produced either in the combined question and answer format or the question only format.

- The combined question and answer format digital question papers have answer spaces for you to complete.
- The question only format digital question papers have an associated digital answer booklet for you to complete.

Can I use a digital question paper?

You can only use a digital question paper if you are disabled or have an additional support need. You may wish to use a digital question paper if you have difficulty reading the paper version of the question paper or if you have difficulty writing your answers on the paper version of the question paper or answer booklet.

You can change the colour of digital question papers; you can have the questions in digital question papers read out to you by the PC, laptop, or tablet; and you can type your answers to the questions in digital question papers.

You may be able to get other software to help you when using digital question papers if required.

How do I request digital question papers?

Your school or college must make a request to SQA for digital question papers on your behalf each year. If you think that you would benefit from using digital question papers, please speak to your teacher or lecturer.

How can I practise using digital question papers?

If you want to use digital question papers you must practise using them before you sit your final exams. Your school or college should give you the chance to practise during class tests or prelims. When practising you should use the PC, laptop or tablet you are planning to use in your final exams. You should make sure you know how to use all the software you will use with digital question papers.

SQA digital question papers from the past five years are available on our website. Digital answer booklets are also available on our website. You can access these on <u>our digital question</u> papers website.

Your school or college may create their own digital question papers for you to use. Please speak to your teacher or lecturer to find out what digital question papers are available for you to practise with.
